

## 3 Fisheries: Wairau, Clarence and Lyell Beach.





### Wairau River Salmon Fishery

- Essentially a river fishery
- Small but consistent run generally 500-1500 adults.
- Heavily fished due to good access and clear flows allows for sighted fishing to salmon
- Trout type gear accounts for bulk of harvest.

### **Clarence Mouth**

- Surf fishery at the river mouth.
- Flat sea and low clear river required for success
- Typically a small run of 500-1500 adults
- Under utilised resource



### **Railway Station - Lyell Creek Mouth Beach**

- A recent, popular beach fishery with clean inshore water the key to success.
- A good year up to 400 fish caught, small in size generally 3-5kg.



#### **Fishery Trends**

- Numbers of salmon have increased since mid 1990's.
- Wairau due to smolt releases from freshwater fish farm and escapees from marine farms.
- Clarence due to ova planting and smolt releases.



#### Trends continued

- Don't appear to be on decline just yet possibly because:
- 1) Headwater spawning areas in a largely natural state and likely to remain that way.
- 2) The rivers are largely unmodified, esp Clarence, & don't have major levels of abstraction
- 3) Smolt entrainment is not an issue.
- 4) Sporadic but regular enhancement efforts over last twenty years.



#### Issues

- Unscreened major hydro scheme for Wairau?
- MDC allocating more water for abstraction from Wairau in latest plan
- Future hydro development threat for Clarence
- Lack of non main stem spawning areas
- Fish farm disease breaking out & spreading to wild stocks
